This book attempts to provide we general physicians with a conveniently sized work for daily reference. It deals with an area of medical practice which is rapidly changing. For that reason regular updating with new material will need to be considered. The book does not profess to be encyclopaedic. In order to keep the size of the book within bounds. there are no sections devoted solely to psychological medicine or to paediatrics. but the book does deal with the more common diseases as revealed by morbidity studies. The main section of the book-A-is concerned with these commoner diseases and is set out in conventional fashion. It is in two parts; the one dealing with therapeutics. the other with clinical pharmacology. The second section-B-reviews therapy in some selected areas. Cancer. pain and tenninal care. contraception. and hyperlipoproteinaemias. It also contains pieces on common emergencies. home renal dialysis and tropical diseases in non-tropical countries. The creation of 'pain clinics'. and the possibilities for the treatment of intractable pain are innovations calculated to be more widely used as we become more aware of theirvalue. The field of rehabilitation is one of which we general physicians are on less familiar ground. To say that by us it is a neglected field is perhaps not too strong a statement. The section on Drugs concentrates on the practical side of drug administration and hence the stress is on the incompatibilities. side effects and contraindications.

And even today, in using the term compensation in heart disease, we are not always careful to signify no more than, in the nature of the particular case, is required. No large imagination is required to reveal to us that readjustment must be a very wide affair, extending to the extreme peripheries and, issues, not of the circulatory system only. We are prone to attach to the term compensation some notion of intervention, of device prearranged by the agency of Nature, as the motorist provides a spare tire in his car. Now, compensation in cardiac disease is no more than that gradually acquired capacity of any fairly stable moving equilibrium by which it has developed and survived, and by which it maintains itself. As in virtue of such continual readaptations it has become more complex, so it presents more defences against interferences. If by past adaptations against certain events a power of accommodation has been acquired, stability is maintained; if not, it fails. These perpetuated readjustments, by which organisms survive and propagate themselves, are, by no means mechanical only; for instance, the responses of antibodies, by which perturbations by incident poisons are neutralized, are compensations. But we must analyze the functions without imputing to them any end outside themselves.

The saddest and most discouraging part of the work of a surgeon is the frequency with which he sees patients suffering from cancer so advanced, that the time for a radical operation has gone for ever. Especially is this true of gastric cancer. In less than 5 percent of the cases I see, is a radical operation possible. The stomach is affected with cancer more frequently than any other organ of the body, and yet, partial gastrectomy is one of the uncommon operations of surgery. This reproach to our profession would be removed, in some measure at least, were the use of the stomach-tube part of the routine of gastric diagnosis. On this point I feel strongly, and have no hesitation in saying, that the number of cases of gastric cancer treated successfully by operation, ought to be, and could be, increased greatly, if only the cases were recognised earlier. Gastric cancer, contrary to popular belief, can be treated successfully, and earlier diagnosis is possible, even with the means at present at our disposal. The operation of gastro-jejunosomy is not a panacea for all the ills to which the stomach is heir, but when performed in cases in which there is a definite organic lesion of the stomach or duodenum, the results are excellent. It is the keystone of gastric surgery. It has been my aim to present methods of diagnosis and treatment, in a manner which may prove useful in practice to practitioners and students. If in any degree this aim be realised, the time spent by the reader and the author will not have been wasted. Limitations of space have prevented me from referring to all the views and operative methods of those who have done such admirable work in gastric surgery.
