The exercises present a methodical way to practice using the dictionary until each entry and its explanation is clearly understood by the student. Concepts will be reinforced with only minimal assistance.

This worksheet is the foundation of becoming intimately familiar with letters. This exercise can be performed by any child who knows the entire alphabet and its order by heart. By the time the student can do the entire worksheet with an average of two seconds per problem, their brains will become hard-wired to recognize letter order.
