This reality is poignant in northern Uganda, where sexual violence against men during the early stages of the conflict was geographically widespread, yet now accounts of those incidents are not just silenced and neglected locally but also widely absent from analyses of the war. Little is known about the lived experience of adult survivors of childhood cancer. In the mid-1970s, 63% of children diagnosed with cancer survived five years. Today, many children diagnosed with and treated for cancer live to adulthood. Although the number of survivors of childhood cancer is increasing, a review of the literature revealed a paucity of studies that examined the self-perceived experiences of adult survivors. The purpose of this descriptive, phenomenological study was to explore the lived experience of adult survivors of childhood cancer. The study was a qualitative study that examined the lived experience of survivors and the meaning or essences of experiences that occurred. Survivors also shared what they want others to know about their experiences. Twelve participants who met inclusion criteria were interviewed. Each participant in this study was at least 18 years of age, had been diagnosed and treated for cancer before the age of 19, and had not required treatment for his/her primary cancer for at least one full year. Study participation consisted of a one-on-one audio-taped interview. Interview data were transcribed verbatim. Uncovered themes were analyzed using Colaizzi's phenomenological technique. Data were coded using the computer analysis program HyperRESEARCH®. Multiple analyses were undertaken to combine, collapse, and extract themes. The result of these analyses was the emergence of four themes. The four themes identified were: (a) there are consequences of having had cancer, (b) uncertainty is ongoing, (c) cancer is a "part of who I am," and (d) support is valued. The results of the study reflect the lived experience of the young adults survivors who were interviewed for this study and cannot be quantified and/or applied to clinical settings. However, the results may increase awareness in clinicians and other health care professionals about possible physical, psychological, psychosocial, developmental and/or spiritual consequences of having had childhood cancer in adult survivors. Modern life has led to an increase in traumatic deaths, such as accidents, murders, suicide, and other types of unanticipated, violent death. Family members and friends grieving a traumatic death face enormous shock, numbness, and despair, as well as

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the need to find hope and God's mercy and grace in the midst of chaos, difficult questions, and confusion. The Christian church and faith community often do not provide appropriate pastoral care to help the bereaved overcome their despair. Jeonghyun Park explores the unique characteristics and dynamics of traumatic grief, or grief in response to traumatic death, and present several approaches to pastoral care. The 2006 Institute of Medicine (IOM) consensus study report *From Cancer Patient to Cancer Survivor: Lost in Transition* made recommendations to improve the quality of care that cancer survivors receive, in recognition that cancer survivors are at risk for significant physical, psychosocial, and financial repercussions from cancer and its treatment. Since then, efforts to recognize and address the unique needs of cancer survivors have increased, including an emphasis on improving the evidence base for cancer survivorship care and identifying best practices in the delivery of high-quality cancer survivorship care. To examine progress in cancer survivorship care since the *Lost in Transition* report, the National Cancer Policy Forum of the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine held a workshop in July 2017, in Washington, DC. Workshop participants highlighted potential opportunities to improve the planning, management, and delivery of cancer survivorship care. This publication summarizes the presentations and discussions from the workshop.

There has been an emergence of epidemiological and clinical research in cancer survivors that can form the basis for a revolution in the quality and nature of health care that survivors receive. This book not only provides the reader with diverse perspectives and data but also integrates this information so it can serve as the foundation necessary to improve and maintain the health of cancer survivors. Reporting of symptoms to health care providers is a complex, multi-determined problem influenced not only by the pathophysiology but also, as we have learned over the years through pain research, by societal, cultural, and biobehavioral factors. This book will consider this important aspect of follow-up for millions of cancer survivors because of the strong reliance on symptom reporting for clinical decision making. In order for us to generate meaningful and effective treatment, we need to better understand the symptom experience in cancer survivors. This book provides much information that will assist us to better understand and manage this complicated end point. The presenting problems need to be articulated and “conceptualized” as clearly as possible by both parties so appropriate actions can be taken. Since health care costs are a major concern for patients, payers, and providers, this area will also be addressed in all the relevant sections. In taking an interdisciplinary perspective, this book illustrates the importance of a team approach to the improvement of health care and associated health, well-being, and functioning in cancer survivors.
